


Crest Nicholson


Crest:


- is the 8th Largest residential and mixed use developer in the UK delivering:
 - Circa 2,500 Dwellings p.a.
 - from 50 sales outlets predominantly in the South East & South West
 - £40m+ mixed commercial turnover p.a.
- has a short term land bank of 14,000 plots
 and a strategic land bank of 18,000 plots
- undertakes 35% of its development in Partnership with the Public Sector, NHS, Other developers etc
- has an leading reputation for design quality and environmental sustainability
- Has a more diverse business model than many of the quoted "volume" house builders



Crest Current Organisation Structure

The Group currently operates four traditional housing divisions; two covering the South East, one in the South West and one to the north of London which extends into the Midlands. In addition we have Crest Strategic Projects and Crest Nicholson Regeneration who operate from the centre.
