View From The Field

With milder temperatures this autumn it might seem strange to see so many fields still unplanted. Oilseed rape and early October winter wheat plantings have established really well but the wet weather returned all too quickly preventing any further progress, just as in 2012. From the middle of October around 124mm (5 inches) of rainfall was recorded in just over four weeks which was compounded by the lack of good drying days. It is unlikely that the soil conditions will improve enough for more sowing to take place so there is going to be another lot of expensive wheat seed being kept over winter again! Spring sown wheat and barley will most probably feature quite heavily again in next year's harvest.

Along with other commodities the wheat price had fallen around 20 percent pre-harvest but has recently made some gains due to Southern hemisphere harvest prospects, but is still a long way short of 2012 prices. The main difference being that quality grain is abundant this year and premiums for anything other than top milling wheat are not worth the risk.
