COMMUNITY ROAD WATCH

At various times during the summer a number of volunteers from Woodhurst have been monitoring traffic numbers, speeding and HGV journeys through the village.

Around 11% of all vehicles passing through the village were travelling at over 35mph, which is the limit at which Police would take action.

The top speed recorded during the sessions was 49mph along Church Street at 8.30am. Disappointingly a number of village residents were also spotted doing over 35mph. Any commercial vehicles which were speeding or HGVs which were travelling through the village were written to by the Roadwatch scheme to remind them of their responsibilities. For example Dominos were contacted regarding the vehicle in the picture which was clocked at 40mph at 6pm.



It is interesting to note that on a normal day we have around 200 vehicles an hour through Church Street at peak times. When roadworks caused delays between Houghton and St Ives, around 600 vehicles per hour were coming through with traffic being higher all day.

The Parish Council are arranging for 30mph Bin Stickers for selected households based on advice from the Community Roadwatch co-ordinator. In addition we are discussing if any further measures can be taken to reduce the numbers of vehicles speeding through the village. There may also be an automated logging device fitted for a short while to measure the vehicles over a longer period to provide evidence for any funding measures we may require to implement any changes; also so that we can monitor more carefully any changes to traffic numbers should any development happen at RAF Wyton in the future.
