Monthly services are as follows: -

1st Sunday Evensong 6.00pm 2nd Sunday No Service

3rd Sunday Family Service at 10.30am 4th Sunday 6.00pm Communion

There is a communion service at 10.00am on the second Thursday of the month.

There is an Open Morning in the church on the first Saturday of every month where you can have a free cup of coffee/tea. There is also a Paperback Book Swap and a Raffle

The Church is open every day for prayer and contemplation.

Feast Week

This is held to celebrate the patron saint of the church St John the Baptist. As his feast day is 24th June, it is held during the week this day falls. There is a varied programme of events which vary from year to year. There is usually a cream teas event, as well as a special service in the church.

Parish Council

The Parish Council usually meets on the second Tuesday of the month in the Village Hall.

Waste Collection and Disposal

It is prudent to put your dustbins out very early, or preferably overnight. The blue bin is collected every other Thursday and the grey and green bins bins on alternate Wednesdays. The blue bin is for recyclables including bottles, the green for garden rubbish and the grey for household. From April 2024, there will be charge of £57.50 a year for green bin collections.

When there is a Bank holiday the day may change.

There is a Recycling Centre at Bluntisham Heath; straight across at Woodhurst Crossroads and it is up the road to your right. You can dump garden rubbish, bulky items etc

Post Office

The nearest Post Offices are at Warboys or Somersham. The collection from the village post box is at 9.00 am every weekday and 7.00 am Saturday. There is a late collection at the letter office in St Peter's Road Huntingdon

Buses

The Number 22 bus operated by Dews Coaches goes into St Ives twice a day (M-F) leaving at 10:01 and 12:01, returning at 11.00 and 13:00. The buses leave from opposite the bus shelter. There is also a Saturday service leaving at 10:00, 13:00 and 15.57 which takes an hour into St Ives and return at 11.45 and 14.45 .There is no return service for the 15,57

The Guided busway service runs a regular service between St Ives and Cambridge.

Mobile library

A mobile library visits the village on the first Wednesday of each month from 10.40am to 11.05am. It stops opposite the 'Old Post Office'.

Newsletter

The Village newsletter "Woodhurst News" is produced on an occasional basis throughout the year.

Police

We are in the St Ives and Ramsey area for community policing. We no longer have designated officers for our area, so to contact Cambridgeshire Police in non-emergency situations, dial 101. For all emergencies dial 999.

Schools

Woodhurst is in the catchment area for Warboys Primary School and the Ramsey Secondary schools, and transport is provided from the village to these schools. There is also transport to St Ivo comprehensive in St Ives. However many children from the village go to a variety of schools in Cambridge, Ely, Huntingdon, Bluntisham, Somersham and St Ives.

Doctors/Dentist
