### Woodhurst Man's Experience at St. Ives.

The front wheel of the motor cycle was buckled, and the side car was damaged. Mr. Bozeat was himself able to get out of the water, and they were taken home by Messrs. G. and C. Chapman, of St. Ives, in a car.
