## (WOODHURST AND OLD HURST) (PROHIBITION OF HEAVY COMMERCIAL VEHICLES) ORDER 1993

NOTICE is hereby given that on 10th December 1993, the Cambridgeshire County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which is:-

To prohibit heavy commercial vehicles exceeding 7.5 tonnes from using:

- (1) Wheatsheaf Way, Church Street and the C119 in Woodhurst, between its junctions with the unclassified road to Old Hurst and the B1040, and
- (2) Church Lane and St. Ives Road and part of Ramsey Road, Old Hurst

Heavy commercial vehicles requiring access for loading and unloading, servicing, or offstreet garages at premises on, or adjacent to, or only accessible from, the affected roads will still be allowed to use the roads.

This Order makes permanent the (Woodhurst and Old Hurst) (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Experimental Traffic Order 1992 brought into operation on the 16th July 1992.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on the 29th December 1993 together with a map showing effects of the Order and Statement of Reasons for having made the Order, may be inspected at the office of the undersigned and at the offices of The Chief Executive, Huntingdonshire District Council, Pathfinder House, St. Mary's Street, Huntingdon during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks from 10th December 1993, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
