

WOODHURST SCHOOL SAVED.

Communications having been received from the managers and parents, strongly opposing the suggestion that Woodhurst school should be closed, it was decided in view of the fact that there would be little or no saving in expenditure, to abandon the proposal.

Ald. Grey said too much money had already been wasted on this school, and he objected to the county being put to the expense of building a new school costing thousands, for the accommodation of about 20 children. He had no intention of allowing himself to be bullied by Woodhurst people.

It was pointed out that the lease of the school expired in about six years, and the clerk said whilst it was a poor old building, it served its purpose.

The report was agreed to.
