LAID TO REST.

Hunts. ex-Police Sergeant's Funeral.

With fitting ceremony the mortal remains of ex-Police Sergeant Frederick Chandler, of Woodhurst, were laid to rest in the Huntingdon cemetery on Thursday afternoon. The large number of mourners, not only from Woodhurst but from St. Ives and Huntingdon was a silent tribute to the high esteem in which deceased had been held. The imposing cortege, headed by members of the Hunt's Constabulary and police pensioners, moved along the High Street to All Saints Parish Church. Chief Supt. Ellwood (deputy Chief Constable), Supt. Afford (Huntingdon), and Inspector Hudson (St. Ives) headed the procession followed by Sergeant Upchurch and Waters, and Constables Sawyer, Moser, Mash, Cliff, Bradford, F. Creamer, Sullivan, Parkwood, Blingsby, Brookbank, Manning, Crawford, Jellins, Dighton, Overton, Paleman, Page, Newberry, Worby, Gilbert, Horford and Cross. Sergeant Broughton, Supt. Fortham and Hall, who acted as bearers, walked beside the hearse. Behind the Constabulary came the police pensioners, headed by ex-Sergeants Gale and Wilson, ex-Sergeants Mansley, Coulson, Hudson, Maple, Dale and Newton and ex-Constables Haast, Jackin, Cook, Rowland, Wright, Evernden, Paleman and Knowles, and ex-Sergeant Finn (late of the Royal Irish Constabulary and now at Woodhurst) and Mrs. Finn.

AT THE CHURCH.

There were many mourners in Church. The service was conducted by the Rev. H. G. Brown, curate of St. Ives. As the cortege entered the organist (Mr. C. Brown) played "The Lord's Prayer." The only hymn sung was "Thy Will be Done." As the coffin left the church the Dead March was played.
