**DEATH OF MISS IVY GURRY**  
**A Loss to the St. Ives District**

Rarely has such an assembly of sympathisers been present at Woodhurst as was the case on Saturday afternoon, when the remains of Miss Ivy Gurry, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Gurry, of Fullard's Farm, Woodhurst, were laid to rest.

Miss Gurry passed away in the County Hospital, having undergone an operation for appendicitis. Possessing an excellent voice, her services as a vocalist were much in request, and she was ever ready to assist with her natural gift. Her charming personality endeared her to a large circle of friends.

The service was conducted by the Rev. H. R. C. Lovell (curate-in-charge of Oldhurst and Woodhurst) and the Rev. Denis Marsh, of St. Ives, Brother Ernest March, of St. Ives, was at the organ.

Among those in the Church and at the graveside were the Woodhurst Boy Scouts, under Scoutmaster Hatwell, and the Girl Guides, who were in charge of Mrs. Lovell (wife of the curate-in-charge).

The remains were borne to their last resting place by Messrs. J. and A. Cooper, E. Chapman and J. Ruff (employees of deceased's father). The inscription on the bronze plate read: "Ivy Elizabeth Gurry, Died April 3rd, 1935, Aged 39 years—R.I.P."
