Although the open space opposite the pond has now been cut, over 20 species of wild flowers were recently counted;

Knapweed, Birds-foot trefoil, Yarrow, Spear Thistle, Smooth sow-thistle, Lady's bedstraw, Red clover, Mallow, Bindweed, Cat's ear, Hawk's-beard, Ribwort Plantain, Hoary Plantain, Bugle, Creeping buttercup, Dandelion, Common Dock, Upright Hedge Parsley, Yellow Iris, Soft Rust, Great Willowherb, Marsh Marigold, Creeping Thistle

A recent Moth Survey in Butt Lane found the fairly rare White Spotted Pinion Moth as well as 4 Large Yellow Underwings, a Cloaked Minor, a Heart & Club, a Lunar-spotted Pinion, a Lesser Common Rustic, a Svensson's Copper Underwing, a Copper Underwing, a Mouse Moth, a Black Rustic, an Early Thorn & several other smaller unidentified moths.
