## FRIENDS OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST CHURCH

*"I wouldn't want the Church to close but at the same time I don't really want to go to Church"*

The Woodhurst Parochial Church Council (PCC) is looking at trying to set up a "Friends" scheme through which people who agree with the above statement can help support the structure of the Church by making financial and other contributions to running costs, minor repairs etc without contributing to or being involved in the spiritual aspect.

Finding new ways of fundraising is always difficult, particularly so in the current economic climate. It costs around £6,500 to maintain, insure and keep the Church open for regular services, weddings, baptisms, funerals, etc. each year – all of which has to be raised by the congregation, villagers or other supporters of the church at Woodhurst.

No institutional funding or maintenance grants support the day to day running and maintenance costs. Many feel that it is important to keep the Church open; whether for regular spiritual fulfilment, as a publicly accessible historic monument within the village or for those life changing moments of birth, marriage and death.

Les Bass among others, lifetime resident of Woodhurst was not a regular Church-goer but had made clear his wish to be buried in the Churchyard, as were his parents before him. A "Friends of St John the Baptist Church" scheme will help to ensure that the Church is able to continue to be a facility for all in the future.

The first step of the proposed scheme is to set up a Committee whose aims are solely focused on the structure of the building rather than the provision of spiritual services. The Committee's first aim is to establish a "Friends of St John the Baptist Church" facility and constitution through which people are able to make regular financial or other donations now matter how large or small.
