Projects Steaming Ahead !

Although the dry Spring 'checked' the growth of the newly planted hedge plants, the majority of them have taken. Any that have died due to the dry weather, will be replaced or 'beat-up' in the autumn. We also planted two Dutch-elm-resistant elm trees, kindly donated by the charity Butterfly Conservation. Elm trees are the food plant for the nationally-rare white-spotted pinion moth, which was found in Butt Lane during a moth survey

In addition, we have spread a mulch of horse manure along the line of the hedge, to help retain moisture and help 'feed' the hedge during its early years.

Over the winter, we had a contractor pollard the willows in the Claypits Conservation Area. The willows have regenerated very guickly and have put on at least 12 to 18 inches of growth already. This work has opened up this part of the Conservation Area around the pond, allowed more light in and made it more welcoming.

All the timber produced as a result of the hedge restoration and pollarding was sold to a local resident and the proceeds will be ploughed back into projects to improve the local environment.

The next of our projects to get underway was the creation of, or should I say the beginnings of the creation of Woodhurst's own wildflower meadow. This is happening on the 'Green' opposite Swan Weir pond. We have cut 6x 1m squares of turf out and planted up with a native hay meadow plants, including; Yarrow, Common Knapweed, Wild Carrot, Lady's Bedstraw, Oxeye Daisy, Birdsfoot Trefoil, Cowslip, Self Heal and Betony. These areas will be left to grow longer to allow the flowers to set seed, (cutting will take place in late Spring and late Summer) hopefully allowing the wildflower plants to spread into the surrounding grassland. In a few years this will become an area full of flowers from spring through to late summer.

Diary Dates

Tuesday 16 August – Natural Woodhurst meeting – all Woodhurst residents invited. It was decided at our AGM in May that every guarter, we would hold an open meeting in the Village Hall to enable the wider Woodhurst community to contribute to the Group's work in the village.

Saturday 20 August – Swan Weir Pondamonium II. Planting up the ledges in the pond with a variety of native wetland plants to improve water quality and increase the amount of wildlife in the pond.
