- 4. Applications, amendments or cancellations of postal votes and amendments or cancellations of proxy votes must reach the Electoral Registration Officer at Pathfinder House, St Mary's Street, Huntingdon, PE29 3TN by 5 pm on Wednesday, 18th April 2018.
- 5. New applications to vote by proxy at this election must reach the Electoral Registration Officer at Pathfinder House, St Mary's Street, Huntingdon, PE29 3TN by 5 pm on Wednesday, 25th April 2018.
- 6. Applications to vote by emergency proxy at this election on grounds of physical incapacity or for work/service reasons must reach the Electoral Registration Officer at Pathfinder House, St Mary's Street, Huntingdon, PE29 3TN by 5 pm on Thursday, 3rd May 2018. The physical incapacity must have occurred after 5 pm on Wednesday, 25th April 2018. To apply on the grounds of work/service, the person must have become aware that they cannot go to the polling station in person after 5 pm on Wednesday, 25th April 2018.
