PARISH COUNCIL (CONTINUED)

WHEATSHEAF CROSSROADS

The Parish Council has been represented in a meeting alongside seven other local Parish Councils, a representative from Envar (Green Waste Recycling Site) and the St Ives and District Road Safety Committee to discuss the Wheatsheaf Crossroads. All those present agreed the ideal solution would be a roundabout at the crossroads. However with the likely cost potentially somewhere over £1million and with the crossroads sitting 49th out of 88 in the County Council's list of junctions under safety review, there appears to be no easy solution to this. The Road Safety Committee has agreed to look into some other funding methods and other safety measures and will report back in the near future.

MAINTENANCE

The Parish Council continue to look at what maintenance needs carrying out around the village. Our contractors will be engaged to thin out the reeds and overhanging vegetation in Ridges Pond (South Street) which needs a bit of attention. Grass cutting and leaf clearing will also be carried out as per previous years

TOWNLANDS CHARITY

The Townlands Charity can be traced back some centuries and exists to use monies received in rent from an arable field near the conservation area to distribute amongst those pensioners of the village who elect to receive it- previously around £25. Those who have previously applied do not need to re-apply but should any one of pensionable age who does not currently receive funds from the Charity, then you should contact the Parish Clerk in the first instance on 07741 418444 or parish.clerk@woodhurst-cambs.com only one applicant per household. The amount payable this year is likely to be less than previous years as the Charity had to take out specific insurance on the land owned last year.

TRAFFIC CALMING

Thank you to all those who responded to the Parish Council Traffic Survey earlier this year- we had a total of 75 responses which is a 25% response rate from the number of people on the Electoral Roll. Our initial Local Highways Initiative (LHI) application has been approved and the items listed below will be presented to a panel in December for consideration. The LHI scheme is a joint funding initiative between the County Council and Parish Councils.

Following careful consideration of the surveys and the options available to us, our application was submitted on the basis of:

- Purchase of a Mobile Speed Indicator Device- this not only informs drivers what speed they are going but also records speed data for future use. It can be moved around the village.
- Creation of 40mph zones on both the Wheatsheaf Road and Old Hurst Road before the 30mph village zones. Many comments in the survey related to trying to slow traffic down more before it entered the village which this will hopefully do.
- Creation of a 20mph zone down South St. South St does not have any pavements and is very narrow in places so should be suitable for a 20mph zone.
- Replacements of reflective bollards around the village. Most of these are either broken or no longer reflective and will serve to improve demarcation of the corners at either end of the village.

(Speed bumps are proving so unpopular with householders that the County Council have moved away from installing these- due to increased noise etc and even potential re-sale effects on houses and our streetlighting is not adequate to install any priority narrowing).

However this is the start of a process and if successful we can use the data from the Mobile Speed Device to assess future options and additional applications. The Parish Council has allocated £5,000 of reserves for this application and if we are unsuccessful we shall still use this money to implement some of the above measures ourselves.

There are of course habitual speeders who will continue to ignore any measures put in place and we would ask for cooperation in reporting such vehicles if you are out and about and are able to obtain a registration number- these can be easily reported on the Cambs Police website.
