Local Highways Initiative (LHI) Bid

Following the failure of our last LHI bid for funding to improve road safety within the village, we have now raised a new bid for this year's round of funding. This will hopefully allow measures to be introduced at the entrances of the village to reduce speed.

In addition, selected households will soon be contacted with regard to putting 30mph stickers on their bins. This is thought to be an effective measure at strategic points within the village rather than putting them on every bin.

The Parish Council are also talking to neighbouring councils about borrowing a Speed Indicator Device to enable data gathering to back up our bid. We won't know the results until at least March 2020, and any scheme which is approved is likely to be installed later on that year.

Dog Mess

Whilst we expect dog walkers to clear up after their dogs and place the deposits in the various bins around the village, we do not expect residents to save up their dogs output for a couple of weeks, we assume from a garden, and put it in an unsealed compost bag in the bin at West End.

This causes the bin liner to get pushed down into the bin and our contractors then have to remove all the bags placed on top before emptying it out. It's a bad enough job already without that, so please dispose of your dogs home produce in your own bin.

Phone Box Defibrillator

The installation of the defibrillator in the phone box is imminent and will be a potential life saving addition to the village. This has been funded by donations made to the First Responder appeal a few years ago with the balance being met by the Parish Council. On-going maintenance costs will be also be met by the parish council. Many thanks to Lynn Crossland who will be stepping down as our resident First Responder and who has been instrumental in getting the defibrillator installed.
