PARISH COUNCIL

Wheatsheaf Crossroads

Like all of you, the councillors were shocked by tragic events at the Wheatsheaf Crossroads in November. As a parish council we have been supporting our County Councillor, Steve Criswell, in the work he has undertaken since last spring in trying to find, and fund, a suitable solution to make the junction a safer one. There is no quick fix to the problem and the on-going water main replacement is only going to cause a further hazard, so I urge you all to take care.

Streetlights

Over the past few months we have been looking for a new energy supplier for our streetlights following a decision by Cambridgeshire County Council to end the previous process of organising all the power for the county and charging that back to the various town and parish councils. I am pleased that following a long search we have recently agreed a contract with OPUS to supply our energy at a fixed price until 2023.

On a slightly different tack, we have recently ordered the new streetlight for the eastern end of the village after it was removed twice in short succession early in 2019 by errant motor vehicles. Thankfully the excavation work and most of the rebuilding is now complete at the properties that were affected by the two crashes and we are finally in a position to have the streetlight replaced.

Traffic Calming & Local Highways Improvement Scheme

As you may remember from last summer, we were unsuccessful in gaining funding for the road safety measures we had identified as part of the Local Highways Improvement (LHI) scheme. Following much discussion at council meetings, we submitted a bid this year for funding for some form of traffic calming at the entrances to the village. The highways department identified that 40mph "buffer zones" between the existing 60mph and 30mph zones would be effective and I recently attended the LHI panel to put forward our arguments for funding. At the time of writing, we are yet to hear if this bid for funding has been successful.

The Parish Council has committed a substantial amount of the precept to traffic calming and should we be unsuccessful once again with our bid, we will look to finance our own improvements, but given our limited resources, it is likely to be less effective than any County Council backed scheme.

Friend against Scams

The councillors have recently resolved to get involved in the "friends against scams" campaign. We have all agreed to take part in online training sessions which will help us to protect ourselves and others within our community. Details of the scheme can be found elsewhere in the newsletter and I urge you all to register and undergo the 20 minute session online. It may help you identify a scam being carried out on you, or a vulnerable friend or family member. If you need to know more information, please do not hesitate to ask one of your councillors.

- 4 Be wise to postal scams. No legal company will ask for money to claim a prize.
- **Keep personal details safe.** They could be used fraudulently in the wrong hands.
- **Research the credentials of the company.** Be certain they're not bogus.
- **Be online savvy.** Check who you're communicating with online.
- **Talk to someone you trust.** If you're suspicious.
- **Report a scam.** Help expose the criminals.
- 10 **Know you are not alone.** Anyone can be a victim, report it and get the right support.
