PARISH COUNCIL

After a number of online meetings it was a pleasure to be back in the Village Hall for our last couple of socially distanced Parish Council meetings, although it is a bit chilly with all the doors open! Hopefully we can continue in this vein until things get back to normal, but rest assured we are doing everything we can to continue running the council in a safe way.

PARISH COUNCIL CONTINUED

Road Safety continues to be a recurring theme on the agenda and a new LHI bid was recently submitted for the funding of a Speed Indicator Device (SID) of our own. The proposed works from the last successful bid to provide buffer zones on the village approaches was, for obvious reasons, delayed, but work will hopefully start in the next few weeks.

A temporary SID will appear around the village over the next few months courtesy of Community Roadwatch Ltd, which will help with gathering more data for our bid presentation in the new year. We saw a significant increase in HGV traffic through the village earlier in the year, but this seems to have dropped off a lot following contact with a number of companies, both local and national. The Parish Council continues to monitor the situation so if you see an oversize lorry please report to Simon.Brown@woodhurst-cambs.com with as much detail as possible, ideally date, time Reg No and any company names.

Parish Council meeting dates for 2021 were recently agreed and will shortly be available on the website. Please remember that you are required to register with the parish clerk for track and trace purposes if you wish to attend a meeting. Full details are printed on the agenda for each meeting.

The church porch, The bus shelter, Maycroft and The paddock opposite Fullards Farm.

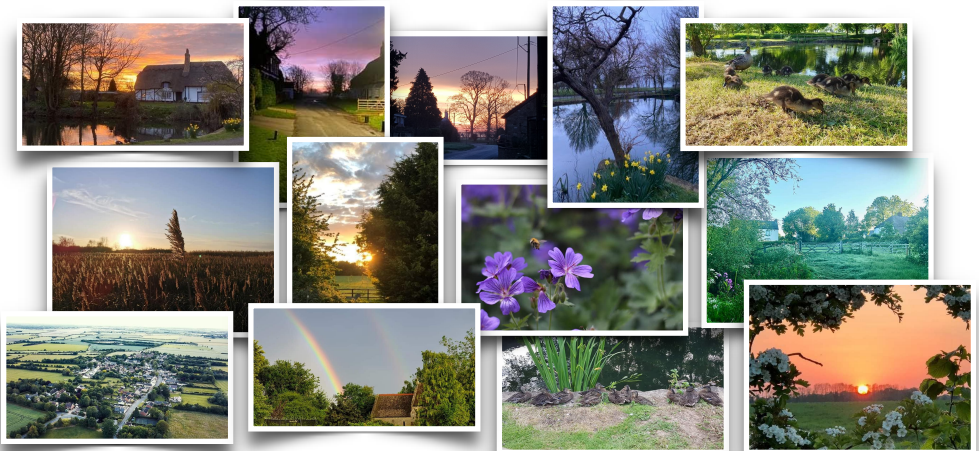

This winter, it's really important that we all remember that the NHS is here to help you stay well, safely.

The NHS have been working hard to make changes to how healthcare is provided to make it safe for you during the ongoing coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

If you're worried about your health, don't delay. The sooner you get advice, the better. Depending on your symptoms, you can get advice from your local pharmacy, GP practice or NHS 111. For minor health concerns, your local pharmacist can help. GP practices offer remote consultations online or by phone, or if you need a face-to-face appointment, they will tell you what to do.

If you need medical help fast, think you need to go to an Emergency Department (A&E) or you're not sure what to do, use NHS 111 first – online or by phone to get clinical advice or direction to the most appropriate services for treatment for you.



You can also help us to help you. If you are over 65, have a long-term health condition or are pregnant, it is more important than ever this year to ensure you have your free flu vaccination. Just speak to your GP or pharmacist to book an appointment. You can also find more information at www.nhs.uk/flu vaccine.

Be sure to also stock up your medicine cabinet with winter self-care essentials too. Many over-the-counter medicines (including paracetamol and ibuprofen) are available to help relieve symptoms of common winter illnesses and you can find further information at www.nhs.uk.

To help prevent further spread of Coronavirus (COVID-19) please follow current Government guidelines for the area you live in at all times. If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus it's important you get tested as soon as possible. You can apply for a test online via www.nhs.uk/coronavirus, or by calling 119.

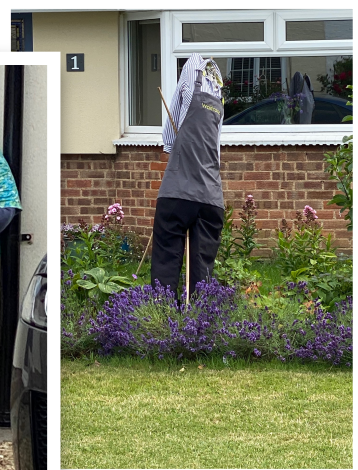
