PARISH COUNCIL

ENVAR

We continue to monitor the situation with the Envar planning application. It is likely to be May before this is discussed at County Council Planning Committee, but we fully support County Councillor Criswell's recent motion opposing the use of Incinerators at the full council meeting.

WHEATSHEAF CROSSROADS

You may have seen that funding of £7.6m has now been allocated for the installation of traffic lights at Wheatsheaf Crossroads. This will hopefully make a real difference to the way the junction operates and make it safer for residents leaving the village

LOCAL HIGHWAYS INITIATIVE

We are due to present the case for a 20mph speed limit in South Street to the LHI Funding panel at the end of the month and are in discussions with Highways about the siting of new poles to accommodate our "SID" (speed indicator device) so that it can be moved around the village. We're not allowed to use the poles for existing speed signs, so this may mean a couple of empty poles spring up on the verges in Church Street and South Street. Once we have agreed a plan with Highways we will contact those who live by a planned pole.

PAVEMENT ACCESS

It has been brought to the attention of the council that cars are frequently being parked on pavements in Church Street. There is no restriction on this, as far as we know, but please make sure that vehicles are parked with consideration for our wheelchair and mobility scooter users, and allow them ample room to pass. This also includes bins that are being put out for collection – we will also be contacting HDC to ask their operatives to make sure they leave ample space when replacing collected bins.

ELECTION

As this is an election year, the council term comes to an end in May and anyone who wishes to stand can be nominated for election. We're not sure who of the current councillors may be standing again, but would like to thank them for their service and support over the last few years. Don't forget there is now a clothes bank in the Village Hall car park, so if you have any clothing, handbags, belts or shoes please feel free to bag them up and put them in.



As with the last few years, the world has thrown many things at us, that would have been unthinkable not that long ago. Unfortunately over recent weeks, even more heartbreak has occurred and the people of Ukraine are now having to abandon their homes, fight for their freedom and deal with the separation from or loss of loved ones.

An urgent call went out from Rachel Griffin on 1st Mar for donations to support those refugees who have arrived at the Polish border with minimal



belongings. The request brought into sharp focus the fact that even within our wider

community there are people who are directly affected by the horrible events, with Rachel's friend and colleague, Zayheda organising the collection.

Sally Barrett planned to take her donations over to Zayheda later that week and said she'd be happy to take others at the same time. Due to the overwhelming response from the village, this ending up with Sally's becoming a collection hub and with a friend she managed to sort and pack all the donations. Roger and Pam Growler and Alvin Augstein then provided the transport with Katherine and Jeff Hickson on active standby in case three vehicles was not sufficient! Although we wish it hadn't been necessary, a big thank you goes to the whole team and the village, and our thoughts and support go out to Ukraine.
